

We know everyone is looking forward to enjoying the beautiful weather this Memorial Day Weekend and there is no better local spot than Shelburne Beach! However, the Beach is not officially open yet, so "know before you go!" We only just received the word from State and local officials on Wed. that we are allowed to open the beach and can move forward with planning. We hope to open on schedule (June 15) or sooner if we can get supplies, staffing and training in place by then. Bathrooms can not be opened until we are able to clean and sanitize them multiple times a day, and we need our summer staff available to do that. We also need to take precautions and make sure our protocols are in place to keep staff and patrons safe. Please understand we are working on this as quickly as possible, but this year is more challenging than normal to be sure we meet all the new guidelines and requirements.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- **Bathrooms are currently closed.** Please plan ahead and only stay for a short time. If you need to "go", please go home! Bring hand sanitizer, as bathrooms aren't available for hand washing.
- **Groups must be 10 or less.** Please social distance at least 6 feet away.
- We recommend you **don't use the picnic tables as tables are not sanitized.** Or bring your own table.
- **All normal rules apply: NO DOGS, no picnicking or sunbathing at the boat launch area, no campfires.**
- Beach passes are not available for sale yet. We will put out notice when they are and the best protocol to get your 2020 Beach Pass safely.

COVID-19 BEACH GUIDELINES

- **Do not visit Shelburne Beach if you are feeling ill** or have any symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell.
- Please wash your hands before and after your visit to the Beach.
- We recommend you wear a mask when in close proximity to others.
- The Volleyball Court is closed until further notice.
- Basketball Court is for solo shooting or members of the same household. If others are waiting to use it, please be respectful and limit your time.
- The Playground equipment is not sanitized. If parents allow children on playground, please supervise closely to help social distance and use hand sanitizer immediately after playing.
